BAM Investments Corp. (“BAM Investments”) (formerly BNN Investments Ltd.) owns all of the Class A voting shares (the “Voting Shares”), all of the Capital Shares and all of the Class AA Preferred Shares, Series 2 of the Company. BAM Investments is a public company whose principal business mandate is to provide holders of its common shares with a leveraged investment in BAM Shares. Prior to closing, the Company will subdivide the existing Capital Shares held by BAM Investments so that after the Offering an equal number of Preferred Shares and Capital Shares will be outstanding.

Purchase of BAM Shares

Pursuant to a securities purchase agreement (the “Securities Purchase Agreement”) dated as of December 20, 2006 between the Company and an affiliate of Scotia Capital Inc. (“Scotia Capital”), the Company has agreed to purchase 3,534,000 additional BAM Shares for cash consideration funded by the proceeds of the Offering at a price of \$54.68 per share, being the closing price of a BAM Share on the Toronto Stock Exchange (the “TSX”) on December 19, 2006. No fees will be payable by the Company to the affiliate of Scotia Capital in respect of the purchase of BAM Shares.

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New Issue Conditions

The Company may only complete the Offering if it complies with its articles of incorporation. The share conditions for the Class A Preferred Shares contained in the articles of incorporation, as amended, require that the following conditions be satisfied at closing:

Listing

The Company has received conditional approval to list the securities distributed under this short form prospectus on the TSX. Listing will be subject to the issuer fulfilling all of the listing requirements of the TSX.

The Company is considered to be a mutual fund but has been exempted from certain of the protections provided by the policies of the Canadian securities regulators applicable to conventional mutual funds.

See “Investment Considerations and Risk Factors” for a discussion of certain factors that should be considered by prospective purchasers of Series 3 Preferred Shares. There is no market through which these securities may be sold and purchasers may not be able to resell securities purchased under the short form prospectus. This may affect the pricing of the securities in the secondary market, the transparency and availability of trading prices, the liquidity of the securities, and the extent of issuer regulation. In addition, on retraction of the Series 3 Preferred Shares holders will be issued Series 1 Debentures (as defined below). An affiliate of Scotia Capital, one of the Underwriters, has agreed to sell BAM Shares to the Company following closing of the Offering and will receive the proceeds of the Offering as consideration therefor. Consequently, the Company may be considered a connected issuer of Scotia Capital. See “Interest of Management and Others in Material Transactions”.

In connection with the Offering, the Underwriters may over-allot or effect transactions which stabilize or maintain the market price of the Series 3 Preferred Shares offered at levels other than those which might otherwise prevail in the open market. Such activities, if commenced, may be discontinued at any time.

Redemption:

Series 3 Preferred Shares may be redeemed by the Company at any time on or after January 10, 2012 and prior to January 10, 2019 (the "Series 3 Redemption Date") at a price (the "Series 3 Preferred Share Redemption Price"), which until January 9, 2016, will equal \$26.00 per share plus accrued and unpaid dividends and which will decline by \$0.25 each year thereafter. Purchase of BAM Shares: On or after closing, the Company will acquire 3,534,000 additional BAM Shares from an affiliate of Scotia Capital at a price of \$54.68 per share for consideration consisting of cash funded by the proceeds of the Offering. No fees will be payable by the Company to the affiliate of Scotia Capital in respect of the purchase of BAM Shares.

Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations

Taxation of the Company: The Company currently qualifies, and intends to continue to qualify, as a mutual fund corporation under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) (the “Tax Act”). As a result of the Company qualifying as a mutual fund corporation under the Tax Act and because the Company deducts expenses in computing its taxable income, the Company should not be subject to any material net income tax liability.

Taxation of Shareholders Resident in Canada:

Dividends

Ordinary dividends received by individuals on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be subject to the normal gross-up and dividend tax credit rules applicable to dividends received on shares of a taxable Canadian corporation. Draft legislation released by the Minister of Finance (Canada) proposes to enhance such gross-up and dividend tax credit for “eligible dividends” (as defined) received after 2005 from taxable Canadian corporations.

Ordinary dividends received by corporations, other than specified financial institutions, on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will generally be deductible in computing taxable income.

Ordinary dividends received by specified financial institutions on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be deductible in computing taxable income, provided that certain conditions applicable to term preferred shares are met, such as the 10% ownership restriction.

Ordinary dividends received by private corporations (and certain other corporations) on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be subject to a refundable tax under Part IV of the Tax Act, generally at the rate of 33⅓%.

Ordinary dividends received by certain corporations other than private corporations on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be subject to a 10% tax under Part IV.I of the Tax Act.

Dispositions

A disposition of a Series 3 Preferred Share held as capital property, whether by way of redemption, retraction or otherwise, may result in a capital gain or a capital loss to the holder thereof.

Interest on Series 1 Debentures

Interest accrued to, or receivable or received before, the end of a taxation year will be included in income of a holder of Series 1 Debentures that is a corporation, partnership, unit trust or trust of which a corporation is a beneficiary. Interest on the Series 1 Debentures received or receivable in a taxation year by a taxpayer who is an individual or trust of which neither a corporation or a partnership is a beneficiary will be included in income for that year.

For a detailed explanation of the Canadian federal income tax considerations, see “Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations”.

Investment Considerations and Risk Factors

An investment in Series 3 Preferred Shares is subject to certain risk factors which prospective investors should consider before purchasing such shares. An investment in Series 3 Preferred Shares does not constitute an investment in the BAM Shares. The value of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be influenced by factors which are not within the control of the Company, including the financial performance of Brookfield Asset Management, interest rates, foreign currency exposure and other financial market considerations. The Company is considered to be a mutual fund but does not generally operate in accordance with, and has been exempted from, certain provisions of the policies and rules of Canadian securities regulators applicable to conventional mutual funds. There is currently no public market for the Series 3 Preferred Shares. If the Company determines to lend BAM Shares, the Company will be exposed to risk of loss and if the Company needs to write covered call options, there is no assurance a liquid exchange market will exist to permit the Company to do so on desired terms. If issued on a retraction of Series 3 Preferred Shares, the Series 1 Debentures will be illiquid investments. See “Investment Considerations and Risk Factors”.

Eligibility for Investment

In the opinion of Torys LLP and Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP, the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be qualified investments under the Tax Act for trusts governed by registered retirement savings plans, registered retirement income funds, deferred profit sharing plans or registered education savings plans and the Series 1 Debentures, if issued on the date of this short form prospectus, will be qualified investments under the Tax Act for trusts governed by registered retirement savings plans, registered retirement income funds, registered education savings plans or deferred profit sharing plans, other than deferred profit sharing plans for which the Company, or a corporation with which the Company does not deal at arm’s length, is the employer.

Book-Entry Only System

Registration of interests in and transfers of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be made only through the book-entry only system of The Canadian Depository for Securities Limited (“CDS”). Series 3 Preferred Shares must be purchased, transferred and surrendered for retraction or redemption through a participant in the CDS book-entry only system. Beneficial owners of Series 3 Preferred Shares will not have the right to receive physical certificates evidencing their ownership of such shares.

THE COMPANY

The Company was incorporated under the laws of the Province of Ontario on July 12, 2001. The Company's articles of incorporation were amended on August 2, 2001 to change its name from Brass Split Corp., on August 24, 2001 to create the Class A Preferred Shares and Capital Shares, on August 25, 2003 to create the Class AA preferred shares and make other amendments, on March 22, 2004 to amend the terms of the Class AA Preferred Shares and the Capital Shares and to create the Class AA Preferred Shares, Series 1 (the "Series 1 Preferred Shares") and the Class AA Preferred Shares, Series 2 (the "Series 2 Preferred Shares"), and on November 6, 2006 to change its name to BAM Split Corp. The Company has its registered and head office at Suite 300, BCE Place, 181 Bay Street, Box 771, Toronto, Ontario, M5J 2T3, telephone: (416) 363-0061.

The Company's investment objective is to hold a portfolio of BAM Shares in order to generate fixed preferential cumulative quarterly dividends for the holders of the Company's Preferred Shares and to enable the holders of the Company's Capital Shares to participate in any capital appreciation in the BAM Shares. The policy of the Company is to hold the BAM Shares and not to sell the BAM Shares, except as described herein.

BAM Investments owns all of the Voting Shares, all of the Series 2 Preferred Shares and all of the Capital Shares of the Company. Prior to closing, the Company will subdivide the existing Capital Shares held by BAM Investments so that after the Series 3 Preferred Shares are issued as described herein, an equal number of Preferred Shares (of all classes and series) and Capital Shares will be outstanding. BAM Investments is a public company whose principal business mandate is to provide holders of its Capital Shares with a leveraged investment in BAM Shares. The issuance of the Series 3 Preferred Shares pursuant to the Offering will provide financial leverage to holders of common shares of BAM Investments, consistent with its mandate.

As a mutual fund, BAM Split is subject to certain restrictions and practices contained in securities legislation, including National Instrument 81-102 ("NI 81-102"), which are designed in part to ensure that the investments of the mutual fund are diversified and relatively liquid and to ensure the proper administration of the mutual fund. The company is managed in accordance with these restrictions and practices. However, BAM Split has been exempted from certain of the protections provided by securities legislation applicable to conventional mutual funds, including certain provisions of NI 81-102.

PURCHASE OF BAM SHARES

Pursuant to the Securities Purchase Agreement dated as of December 20, 2006, between the Company and an affiliate of Scotia Capital, the Company has agreed to purchase an aggregate of 3,534,000 BAM Shares at a price of \$54.68 per share, being the closing price of a BAM Share on the TSX on December 19, 2006.

All BAM Shares currently owned by the Company are held by Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (the "Custodian") pursuant to the provisions of the Custodial Services Agreement described under "Auditors, Transfer Agent, Registrar and Custodian". The BAM Shares to be purchased under the Securities Purchase Agreement will also be deposited with and held by the Custodian.

BAM SHARES

BAM Shares may be sold to fund the retraction or redemption of any Preferred Shares or Capital Shares, following the receipt of any stock dividends, or to meet obligations of the Company in respect of liabilities including extraordinary liabilities. In addition, the Company may also sell BAM Shares, if necessary, to fund a portion of the Preferred Share dividends.

In order to generate additional income, the Company may lend the BAM Shares owned by it to borrowers acceptable to the Company pursuant to the terms of a securities lending agreement between the Company and any such borrower (a "Securities Lending Agreement"). Under a Securities Lending Agreement: (i) the borrower will pay to the Company a negotiated securities lending fee and will make compensation payments to the Company equal to any distributions received by the borrower on the securities borrowed; (ii) the securities loans must qualify as "securities lending arrangements" for the purpose of the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) (the "Tax Act"); and (iii) the Company will receive prescribed collateral security. Any such securities lending activities will be conducted in accordance with applicable securities legislation or any exemption therefrom.

DIVIDEND POLICY

The dividends on Preferred Shares are funded primarily from the dividends received on the BAM Shares. Based on the current dividends paid on the BAM Shares, it is expected that the Company will have approximately 1.08 times coverage on the dividends to be paid on the Preferred Shares including the Series 3 Preferred Shares. As such, the dividends paid on the Series 3 Preferred Shares will constitute ordinary dividends to the holders of the Series 3 Preferred Shares.

If, for any reason, the dividends received by the Company on the BAM Shares are insufficient to fully fund Preferred Share dividends, the Company will sell BAM Shares or write covered call options on its BAM Shares to the extent necessary to fund any shortfall. Any portion of the dividends on the Preferred Shares which is derived from the proceeds of sale of the BAM Shares will consist of ordinary dividends or a combination of a capital gains dividend and ordinary dividends. Any option premium received in a year (other than in respect of options outstanding at year end) would be distributed as a capital gains dividend in the year on the Preferred Shares.

If the dividends received by the Company on the BAM Shares, less the administrative and operating expenses of the Company, exceed the amount of the dividends on the Preferred Shares, the policy of the board of directors of the Company is to pay any excess as dividends on the Capital Shares. Any dividends received by the Company, net of expenses and the dividends on all the Preferred Shares, which are not paid out will be invested in fixed income securities as determined by the Administrator. The current policy of the board of directors of the Company is to pay these amounts as dividends on the Capital Shares provided that the Net Asset Value per Unit exceeds \$36.00. See "Net Asset Value per Unit".

In addition, if the Company realizes capital gains and would be liable to pay tax thereon, the Company may declare a capital gains dividend on the Capital Shares. Such dividend will minimize any tax payable by the Company and, as such, should benefit the Company and its shareholders. The Company expects to pay such dividends in Capital Shares rather than in cash.

NET ASSET VALUE PER UNIT

"Net Asset Value per Unit" on any particular day is defined as the value of the BAM Shares held by the Company plus (minus) the amount by which the value of the other assets of the Company exceed (are less than) the liabilities (including any extraordinary liabilities) of the Company as at the relevant date and the redemption value of the Voting Shares, all as determined by the board of directors of the Company, divided by the total number of Units outstanding. A "Unit" is considered to consist of one Capital Share and one Preferred Share. For greater certainty, the Preferred Shares will not be treated as liabilities for purposes of determining Net Asset Value per Unit.

The BAM Shares will be valued as follows:

- (a) the net amount received by the Company per BAM Share on the disposition of any BAM Shares sold to fund a retraction or redemption; or
- (b) to the extent that BAM Shares are not sold to fund a retraction or redemption on the applicable date, the Company will value the BAM Shares using the closing price for BAM Shares on the TSX on the trading day immediately preceding the relevant date; or, if no trading in BAM Shares occurred on such day on the TSX, the closing price for BAM Shares on such other exchange or market as the Administrator may select on such day; or, if no closing price is available from any exchange or market for BAM Shares, the average of the bid and ask prices for such shares at close of trading on the TSX on such day.

The value of the BAM Shares determined as set out above may differ from the value of the BAM Shares determined under Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

If, on the applicable date of the determination of Net Asset Value per Unit, the Company is entitled to a refund of refundable taxes but such refund is not immediately available, the Company will either defer payment in cash of a portion of the redemption price until the refund is received by the Company or take steps to monetize or otherwise convert the refund into cash. In any event, any refundable taxes not then available to the

Company will be treated as an asset equal to the realizable value thereof as determined by the board of directors.

Unless otherwise required, the Net Asset Value per Unit will be calculated once per month on the last business day of the month. Such information will be provided by the Administrator to holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares upon request by calling 416-363-0061 or through the Internet at www.bamsplit.com.

BAM Share Dividends

The declaration and payment of dividends on the BAM Shares are at the discretion of the board of directors of Brookfield Asset Management, which has announced that it supports a stable and consistent dividend policy. Dividends on the BAM Shares are paid quarterly, normally at the end of February, May, August and November of each year. During 2003, Brookfield Asset Management increased the quarterly dividend payable to holders of its Class A and B Limited Voting Shares from \$0.25 per share to \$0.26 per share, effective with the dividend paid on August 31, 2003. On February 11, 2004, Brookfield Asset Management announced an increase in its quarterly dividends to \$0.27 per share, effective with the dividend paid on May 31, 2004. Brookfield Asset Management also paid a stock dividend of one half of a BAM Share for each BAM Share held on May 1, 2004, paid on June 1, 2004. The first dividend following this stock dividend was US\$0.14 per share, and was paid on August 31, 2004. This dividend, as with all subsequent dividends, was paid in US currency. Subsequent dividends of US\$0.14 per Share were paid on November 10, 2004 and February 28, 2005. During 2005, Brookfield Asset Management increased the quarterly dividend payable to holders of the BAM Shares to US\$0.15 per BAM Share effective with the dividend paid on March 31, 2005. Brookfield Asset Management also paid a stock dividend of one half of a BAM Share for each BAM Share held on April 19, 2006, paid on April 27, 2006. The first dividend following this stock dividend was US\$0.16 per BAM Share and was paid on May 31, 2006.

DESCRIPTION OF SHARE CAPITAL

The authorized capital of the Company consists of an unlimited number of Capital Shares, an unlimited number of Class A Preferred Shares, an unlimited number of Class AA Preferred Shares and an unlimited number of Voting Shares of which 9,548,000 Capital Shares, 5,000,000 Class A Preferred Shares, 3,200,000 Series 1 Preferred Shares, 1,348,000 Series 2 Preferred Shares and 100 Voting Shares are outstanding at the date hereof. The following description will be true at closing and gives effect to articles of amendment that will be filed prior to that date.

DETAILS OF OFFERING

Class AA Preferred Shares

Directors’ Right to Issue in One or More Series

The Class AA Preferred Shares may be issued at any time or from time to time in one or more series, subject to the limitations set out in the articles of incorporation, as amended, of the Company. The board of directors of the Company is authorized to fix before issue the number, the designation of and, subject to the

rights and restrictions attaching to the Class AA Preferred Shares as a class, the rights, privileges, restrictions and conditions attaching to the Class AA Preferred Shares of each series.

Voting Rights

Except as required by law and the approval requirements for certain fundamental changes under NI 81-102, the holders of the Class AA Preferred Shares as a class shall not be entitled to receive notice of, to attend or to vote at any meeting of the shareholders of the Company (including with respect to share consolidations or subdivisions of the Capital Shares) other than meetings of the holders of Class AA Preferred Shares. The Company may, without the approval of the Class AA Preferred Shares, (i) increase or decrease the maximum number of authorized Class AA Preferred Shares or increase the maximum number of authorized shares of a class having rights or privileges equal or superior to the Class AA Preferred Shares; (ii) effect an exchange, reclassification or cancellation of the Class AA Preferred Shares; and (iii) create a new class or series of shares equal or superior to the Class AA Preferred Shares. Holders of the Class AA Preferred Shares will not be entitled to exercise the votes attaching to any of the BAM Shares held by the Company.

So long as any of the Class AA Preferred Shares are outstanding, the Company shall not, without the approval of the holders of the Class AA Preferred Shares, (i) amend the rights, privileges, restrictions and conditions attaching to the Class AA Preferred Shares; or (ii) wind up or dissolve voluntarily.

Modification

Approval of amendments to the provisions of the Class AA Preferred Shares may be given by a special resolution carried by an affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the votes cast at a meeting of the holders of Class AA Preferred Shares duly called and held for such purpose at which the holders of 10% of the outstanding Class AA Preferred Shares are present in person or represented by proxy or, if no quorum is present at such meeting, at an adjourned meeting at which the holders of Class AA Preferred Shares then present would form the quorum.

Priority

The Class AA Preferred Shares of each series rank senior to the Capital Shares and *pari passu* with the Class A Preferred Shares with respect to payment of dividends and in the distribution of assets in the event of dissolution, liquidation or winding-up of the Company.

Series 3 Preferred Shares

Issue Price

The Series 3 Preferred Shares will have an issue price of \$25.00 per share.

Dividends

Holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares will be entitled to receive quarterly fixed cumulative preferential distributions equal to \$0.2719 per Series 3 Preferred Share. On an annualized basis, this would represent a dividend yield on the offering price of the Series 3 Preferred Shares of approximately 4.35%. Such quarterly distributions are expected to be paid by the Company on or about the 7th day of March, June, September and December in each year. Based on the anticipated closing date of the Offering of January 10, 2007, the initial distribution (which covers the period from completion of the Offering to February 28, 2007) is expected to be \$0.1460 per Series 3 Preferred Share, and is expected to be payable on or about March 7, 2007 to holders of record on February 22, 2007. See "Dividend Policy".

Retraction

Series 3 Preferred Shares may be surrendered for retraction at any time. Retraction payments for Series 3 Preferred Shares will be made on the 15th day of each month, or where such day is not a business day, on the preceding business day (the "Retraction Payment Date") provided the Series 3 Preferred Shares have been surrendered for retraction at least five business days before the 30th day of the relevant month (or, in the case of

February, the last day of the month) (the “Valuation Date”). As used herein, the term “business day” means any day, except for a Saturday or Sunday, which is not a statutory or civic holiday in Toronto, Ontario.

A holder retracting Series 3 Preferred Shares will receive per Series 3 Preferred Share retracted (the “Retraction Consideration”) a number of debentures (the “Series 1 Debentures”) determined by dividing the holder’s aggregate Preferred Share Retraction Price (defined below) by \$25.00. The Series 1 Debentures will be issued by, at the Company’s option in respect of each retraction, either the Company or, if agreed to by BAM Investments, BAM Investments. If the Series 1 Debentures are issued by BAM Investments, BAM Investments will be issued new shares of the Company of equivalent value.

The “Preferred Share Retraction Price” will be equal to the lesser of (i) Net Asset Value per Unit and (ii) \$25.00. Retraction payments will be made on a Retraction Payment Date provided the Series 3 Preferred Shares have been surrendered for retraction at least five business days before the Valuation Date in the preceding month. If Series 3 Preferred Shares are surrendered for retraction thereafter, the Retraction Consideration will be determined on the Valuation Date of the following month and will be paid on the then following Retraction Payment Date.

A holder who surrenders a Series 3 Preferred Share for retraction will receive on the Retraction Payment Date that number of Series 1 Debentures determined by dividing the holder’s aggregate Preferred Share Retraction Price by \$25.00. Fractional Series 1 Debentures will not be issued to a holder and the holder will instead receive a cash payment equal to such fraction multiplied by the value of the Series 1 Debenture that would otherwise have been issued. For the purpose of determining the amount of any such cash payment, all Series 3 Preferred Shares deposited by a holder for retraction will be aggregated.

If any Series 3 Preferred Shares are surrendered for retraction, the Company will consolidate the Capital Shares so that the number of Capital Shares outstanding equals the number of Preferred Shares outstanding. Series 3 Preferred Shares which have been surrendered to the Company for retraction prior to the relevant Valuation Date are deemed to be outstanding until (but not after) the close of business on the relevant Retraction Payment Date, unless not redeemed thereon, in which event such Series 3 Preferred Shares shall remain outstanding and be considered to be surrendered for retraction on the following Retraction Payment Date.

The Company will be obligated to redeem Series 3 Preferred Shares only to the extent that such redemption would not be contrary to any applicable law. If the Company is unable for this reason to redeem all of the Series 3 Preferred Shares surrendered for payment on a Retraction Payment Date, it will redeem on each Retraction Payment Date thereafter, on a *pro rata* basis from shareholders who so surrendered shares, disregarding fractions, such number of Series 3 Preferred Shares not so redeemed as the Company determines it is then permitted to redeem. The Company will repeat such process on each successive Retraction Payment Date until all such Series 3 Preferred Shares have been redeemed.

The retraction privilege described above must be exercised by causing written notice to be received by the Company within the notice period prescribed herein and in the manner described under “Book-Entry Only System”. Series 3 Preferred Shares will be irrevocably surrendered for retraction upon the delivery of such notice to CDS through a participant in the CDS book-entry only system (a “CDS Participant”).

Redemption

Series 3 Preferred Shares may be redeemed by the Company at any time on or after January 10, 2012 and prior to January 10, 2019 (the “Series 3 Redemption Date”) at a price (the “Series 3 Preferred Share Redemption Price”) which, until January 9, 2016, will equal \$26.00 per share plus accrued and unpaid dividends and which will decline by \$0.25 each year thereafter. Any Series 3 Preferred Shares outstanding on the Series 3 Redemption Date will be redeemed for a cash amount equal to the lesser of (i) \$25.00 plus accrued and unpaid dividends and (ii) Net Asset Value per Unit on the Series 3 Redemption Date.

Notwithstanding the first sentence of the prior paragraph, the Company may redeem Series 3 Preferred Shares prior to January 10, 2012 for \$26.00 per share plus accrued and unpaid dividends if, and will not redeem Series 3 Preferred Shares prior to the Series 3 Redemption Date unless, (i) Capital Shares have been retracted; or (ii) there is a take-over bid for the BAM Shares and the board of directors of the Company determines that such bid is in the best interest of the holders of the Capital Shares. In addition, the Company may redeem

Series 3 Preferred Shares on or after January 10, 2012 but prior to the Series 3 Redemption Date if the redemption of the then outstanding Series 3 Preferred Shares will occur using net proceeds from the issuance of a new series or class of preferred shares.

Notice of redemption will be given to CDS Participants holding Series 3 Preferred Shares on behalf of the beneficial owners thereof at least 15 days prior to the Series 3 Redemption Date.

Voting Rights

Except as required by law, holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares will not be entitled to receive notice of, to attend or to vote at any meeting of shareholders of the Company (including with respect to share consolidations or subdivisions of the Capital Shares) other than meetings of the holders of Preferred Shares. Holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares will not be entitled to vote any of the BAM Shares held by the Company.

Notwithstanding the first sentence of the prior paragraph, the approval of holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares is not required for certain fundamental changes as set forth in section 5.1 of NI 81-102, except in the event that, as holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares, they are affected by such changes.

The Company may, without the approval of the Series 3 Preferred Shares, (i) increase or decrease the maximum number of authorized Series 3 Preferred Shares or increase the maximum number of authorized shares of a class having rights or privileges equal or superior to the Series 3 Preferred Shares; (ii) effect an exchange, reclassification or cancellation of the Series 3 Preferred Shares; and (iii) create a new class or series of shares equal or superior to the Series 3 Preferred Shares.

Modification

Approval of amendments to the provisions of the Series 3 Preferred Shares may be given by a special resolution carried by an affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the votes cast at a meeting of the holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares duly called and held for such purpose at which the holders of 10% of the outstanding Series 3 Preferred Shares are present in person or represented by proxy or, if no quorum is present at such meeting, at an adjourned meeting at which the holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares then present would form the quorum.

Priority

The Series 3 Preferred Shares will rank prior to the Capital Shares and on a *pari passu* basis with all other Preferred Shares with respect to the payment of dividends, distributions upon a redemption, retraction or return of capital and distributions upon a dissolution, liquidation or winding-up of the Company. In any such case, the holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares shall be entitled to receive an amount equal to the Series 3 Preferred Share Redemption Price.

Series 1 Debentures

The Series 1 Debentures will be issued under a master trust indenture (the “Master Indenture”) to be entered into as of the date of closing between the Company and Computershare Trust Company of Canada, the trustee appointed under the Master Indenture (the “Indenture Trustee”), as supplemented by the supplemental indenture, to be entered into as of the date of closing between the Company and the Indenture Trustee (the “Supplemental Indenture”) (the Master Indenture and the Supplemental Indenture are referred to collectively as the “Indenture”), which will set out the terms of the Series 1 Debentures. BAM Investments has agreed with the Company to issue Series 1 Debentures at any time to the extent that the Company is not permitted to do so under the terms of its Indenture and BAM Investments may also agree to issue Series 1 Debentures to holders who surrender Series 3 Preferred Shares for retraction at other times. If BAM Investments issues debentures, it will enter into a master trust indenture with a trustee and the Series 1 Debentures issued by BAM Investments will be issued on substantially the same terms as those issued by the Company (other than the restrictions described in the following paragraph which are only applicable to the Indenture to be entered into by the Company).

The Company has agreed to provide DBRS or its successor with written notice at least two business days prior to the issuance of any Series 1 Debentures or unsubordinated indebtedness. The Company shall only issue

Series 1 Debentures provided that (i) the aggregate principal amount of Series 1 Debentures of the Company outstanding following such issuance will not be greater than five percent (5%) of the net asset value as of such date, where for such purposes net asset value is calculated as the value of the Company's assets less the aggregate of the Company's liabilities and the par amount of all outstanding Preferred Shares; and (ii) such issuance would not cause the annual dividend income of the Company for the following year net of expected operating expenses and interest obligations on the Series 1 Debentures calculated after giving effect to such issuance to fall below one hundred percent (100%) of the annual dividend requirements of the Company on the Preferred Shares calculated after giving effect to the related retraction of Series 3 Preferred Shares, unless in each case DBRS or its successor has confirmed in writing prior to such issuance that the rating on the Preferred Shares which are to remain outstanding following such issuance will not be downgraded from their then current rating as a result of such issuance.

The following is a summary of the material terms of the Series 1 Debentures, which does not purport to be complete. For full particulars of such terms, reference should be made to the Indenture.

Principal Amount and Maturity Date

The Series 1 Debentures will have a principal amount of \$25.00 per debenture and will mature on the Series 3 Redemption Date.

Coupon

Holders of the Series 1 Debentures will be entitled to receive quarterly fixed interest payments at a rate of 4.45% per annum. Interest will be paid by the issuer of the Series 1 Debenture (the "Issuer") quarterly on or about the 7th day of March, June, September and December in each year; provided that the Issuer may, at its option, provided no Event of Default (as defined under "Events of Default") has occurred and is continuing, elect to defer payment of interest due on any interest payment date until maturity on the condition that, in the event of such an election, no interest, dividends or other distributions will be permitted to be paid in respect of any of the Company's subordinate classes of securities.

Ranking and Security

The Series 1 Debentures will be direct unsecured obligations of the Issuer and will rank junior to all other unsecured and unsubordinated indebtedness incurred by the Issuer and prior to all Preferred Shares and, if issued by the Issuer, the capital shares of such Issuer, with respect to the payment of interest and repayment of the outstanding principal amount.

Redemption

The Issuer will have the right at any time and from time to time, on not less than 30 and not more than 60 days prior notice, to redeem the Series 1 Debentures in whole or in part, at a price equal to the principal amount outstanding, together with accrued and unpaid interest. All Series 1 Debentures so redeemed will be cancelled and may not be reissued.

Purchase for Cancellation

The Issuer will have the right to purchase the Series 1 Debentures at any time and from time to time, in whole or in part, by private agreement or in the open market or by tender. All Series 1 Debentures issued by such Issuer so purchased and held by such Issuer shall not be considered as outstanding for voting purposes.

Mergers, Consolidations and Sales of Assets

So long as any Series 1 Debentures issued under the Indenture remain outstanding, the Issuer will not enter into any transaction where all or substantially all of the property of the Issuer would become the property of any other person or entity, whether by way of reorganization, consolidation, amalgamation, arrangement, merger, transfer, sale or otherwise, unless:

- (a) the Issuer shall be the surviving entity, or the entity, if other than the Issuer, formed by the amalgamation or consolidation or into which the Issuer is merged or that acquires all or substantially

- all of the property or assets of the Issuer shall (i) be an entity organized and validly existing under the federal laws of Canada or any of its provinces or territories, and (ii) expressly assume, by a supplemental indenture executed and delivered to the Indenture Trustee in form satisfactory to the Indenture Trustee, all of the obligations under the Indenture of the Issuer;
- (b) immediately before and after giving effect to the transaction, no Event of Default or event that with the passing of time or the giving of notice, or both, would constitute an Event of Default shall have occurred and be continuing; and
 - (c) the Indenture Trustee shall be satisfied that the transaction is on terms which substantially preserves and does not impair any of the rights and powers of the Indenture Trustee or the holders of the Series 1 Debentures under the Indenture.

Events of Default

Certain events will be considered as events of default (the “Events of Default”) under the Indenture and will give the holders of Series 1 Debentures the right to accelerate payment of principal and interest on the Series 1 Debentures. These events include:

- (i) the failure to pay principal when due,
- (ii) the failure to pay interest when due, and continuing for 30 days, subject to any election by the Issuer to defer payment of interest,
- (iii) the failure to perform any other covenant in the Indenture or the Series 1 Debentures for 60 days after notice of default is provided,
- (iv) default in the payment of other indebtedness of the Issuer, the value of which exceeds \$50,000,000 resulting in the acceleration of such indebtedness,
- (v) the rendering of judgments against the Issuer for an amount exceeding \$50,000,000 which remains undischarged for a period of 60 days, or such shorter period as may permit a material portion of the asset base to be sold or disposed of, after the right to appeal has expired,
- (vi) certain events of bankruptcy, insolvency or reorganization affecting the Issuer, and
- (vii) the obligations of the Issuer under the Indenture or the Series 1 Debentures ceasing to constitute legal and valid obligations for 60 days after notice of default is provided.

Modification

The Indenture provides that certain modifications of the Indenture and the Series 1 Debentures and the rights of the Series 1 Debenture holders against the Issuer may be made if authorized by extraordinary resolution. Under the Indenture, an “extraordinary resolution”, means a resolution proposed at a duly constituted meeting and passed by the favourable votes of the holders of not less than 66 $\frac{2}{3}$ % of the principal amount of the outstanding Series 1 Debentures present in person or by proxy at the meeting.

BOOK-ENTRY ONLY SYSTEM

Registration of interests in and transfers of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be made only through a book-based system administered by CDS. On or about January 10, 2007 (the “Closing Date”) but in any event no later than January 31, 2007, the Company will deliver to CDS certificates evidencing the aggregate number of Series 3 Preferred Shares subscribed for under the Offering. Series 3 Preferred Shares must be purchased, transferred and surrendered for retraction or redemption through a CDS Participant. All rights of an owner of Series 3 Preferred Shares must be exercised through, and all payments or other property to which such owner is entitled will be made or delivered by, CDS or the CDS Participant through which the owner holds Series 3 Preferred Shares. Upon purchase of any Series 3 Preferred Shares, the owner will receive only the customary confirmation. Reference in this short form prospectus to a holder or owner of Series 3 Preferred Shares means, unless the context otherwise requires, the owner of the beneficial interest in such shares.

The ability of a beneficial owner of Series 3 Preferred Shares to pledge the Series 3 Preferred Shares or otherwise take action with respect to such owner's interest in such shares (other than through a CDS Participant) may be limited due to the lack of a physical certificate.

An owner of Series 3 Preferred Shares who desires to exercise retraction privileges thereunder must do so by causing a CDS Participant to deliver to CDS (at its office in the City of Toronto), on behalf of the owner, a written notice (the "Retraction Notice") of the owner's intention to retract shares sufficiently in advance of the relevant notice date so as to permit the CDS Participant to deliver notice to CDS by the required time. The Retraction Notice may take the form of the notice attached as Exhibit A hereto or such other form as each CDS Participant may prescribe. Any expenses associated with the preparation and delivery of a Retraction Notice shall be for the account of the owner exercising the retraction privilege.

By causing a CDS Participant to deliver a Retraction Notice to CDS, an owner of Series 3 Preferred Shares shall be deemed to have irrevocably surrendered his or her shares for retraction and appointed such CDS Participant to act as his or her exclusive settlement agent with respect to the exercise of the retraction privilege and the receipt of payment in connection with the settlement of obligations arising from such exercise.

Any Retraction Notice which CDS determines to be incomplete, not in proper form or not duly executed shall for all purposes be void and of no effect, and the retraction privilege to which it relates shall be considered for all purposes not to have been exercised thereby. In the event of a determination that a Retraction Notice is incomplete, not in proper form or not duly executed, CDS shall promptly notify the CDS Participant which delivered the retraction notice. A failure by a CDS Participant to exercise retraction privileges or to give effect to the settlement thereof in accordance with the owner's instructions will not give rise to any obligations or liability on the part of the Company to the CDS Participant or the owner.

The Company has the option to terminate registration of the Series 3 Preferred Shares through the book-based system in which case certificates for Series 3 Preferred Shares in fully registered form will be issued to beneficial owners of such shares or their nominees.

CHANGES AFFECTING BAM SHARES

Upon any subdivision, consolidation, reclassification or other similar change to the BAM Shares held by the Company, the Brookfield Asset Management securities received in respect of BAM Shares as a result of such subdivision, consolidation, reclassification or similar change will, together with any residual, be treated as BAM Shares for all purposes relating to the Capital Shares and the Preferred Shares including the retraction prices payable on the Capital Shares and the Preferred Shares.

Upon any distribution (an "extraordinary distribution") by Brookfield Asset Management in respect of BAM Shares, other than a cash dividend or a stock dividend paid in the ordinary course by Brookfield Asset Management, any BAM Shares received will, together with the BAM Shares in respect of which the distribution was made, be treated in the same manner as securities received upon any subdivision, consolidation, reclassification or other similar change. Any other securities or property received upon an extraordinary distribution will either be held by the Company or be sold, in which case the Company shall use the net proceeds to acquire additional BAM Shares and any cash received will be used to acquire additional BAM Shares as determined by the board of directors of the Company.

Unless the board of directors of the Company otherwise determines, upon any reorganization, amalgamation, merger or sale of material assets affecting Brookfield Asset Management, or to which it is a party, the securities of Brookfield Asset Management or any successor thereto received in respect of BAM Shares will, together with any residual, be treated in the same manner as securities received as the result of a subdivision, consolidation, reclassification or similar change to BAM Shares held by the Company and any other securities, property or cash received in respect of BAM Shares will be treated in the same manner as securities, property or cash received upon any extraordinary distribution by Brookfield Asset Management in respect of BAM Shares.

Any transferable rights issued to the Company pursuant to a rights offering by Brookfield Asset Management (other than those with a nominal exercise price) will be sold and the net proceeds of such sale will be used to purchase additional BAM Shares which will, together with the BAM Shares in respect of which such

rights were received, be treated in the same manner as securities received as a result of a subdivision, consolidation, reclassification or similar change.

In the event of a take-over bid for the BAM Shares, the board of directors of the Company will, if it determines that such bid is in the best interests of holders of the Capital Shares, tender the BAM Shares held by the Company to such bid and use the proceeds of such bid to redeem as soon as practicable thereafter the Preferred Shares at the applicable redemption price. The Company will use the balance of the proceeds of such bid for the benefit of the holders of the Capital Shares. Unless the board of directors otherwise determines, in the event of a take-over bid for less than all of the BAM Shares, the Company will redeem at the applicable redemption price from each holder thereof such number of Preferred Shares represented by such holder's *pro rata* share of the BAM Shares tendered to such bid and shall use the balance of the proceeds for the benefit of the holders of the Capital Shares.

The board of directors of the Company may, immediately prior to the redemption of all or substantially all outstanding Capital Shares and Preferred Shares, declare dividends on the Capital Shares, the Preferred Shares or both in an amount necessary to generate a refund of refundable tax paid by the Company under Part IV of the Tax Act.

INVESTMENT CONSIDERATIONS AND RISK FACTORS

The following are certain considerations relating to an investment in the Series 3 Preferred Shares of the Company which prospective investors should consider before purchasing such shares.

Interest Rate Fluctuations

It is anticipated that the market value of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will, at any given time, be affected by the level of interest rates prevailing at such time. An increase in interest rates may have a negative effect on the value of the Series 3 Preferred Shares.

Foreign Currency Exposure

Brookfield Asset Management reports its results in United States dollars. Accordingly, the value of the BAM Shares may fluctuate from time to time with fluctuations in the exchange rate between Canadian and United States dollars. Also, Brookfield Asset Management declares dividends in United States dollars, which are then converted to Canadian dollars for distribution to Canadian holders. Strengthening of the Canadian dollar relative to the United States dollar could reduce the amount of cash available to the Company to pay dividends on its Preferred Shares.

Fluctuations in the Value of BAM Shares

The value of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will vary according to the value of the BAM Shares. The value of the BAM Shares will be influenced by factors which are not within the control of the Company, including the financial performance of Brookfield Asset Management, interest rates and other financial market conditions. Accordingly, the value of the Series 3 Preferred Shares will vary from time to time.

No Ownership Interest

An investment in Series 3 Preferred Shares does not constitute an investment in the BAM Shares. Holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares will not own the BAM Shares held by the Company or have any voting rights in respect of the BAM Shares.

Mutual Fund Policies

The Company is considered to be a mutual fund but does not generally operate in accordance with, and has been exempted from, certain of the policies and rules of Canadian securities regulators applicable to conventional mutual funds.

Securities Lending

The Company may engage in securities lending as described under “BAM Shares”. Although the Company will receive collateral for the loans and such collateral will be marked-to-market, the Company will be exposed to the risk of loss should the borrower default on its obligations to return the borrowed securities and the collateral is insufficient to reconstitute the portfolio of loaned securities.

Limitations on Liquidity of BAM Shares

While the Company’s policy is to hold the BAM Shares and not engage in trading, there may be circumstances in which the BAM Shares will have to be sold, including to fund retractions and redemptions of Preferred Shares or Capital Shares. The Company’s ability to sell a substantial portion of the BAM Shares may be limited by resale restrictions under applicable securities laws which will affect when or to whom the BAM Shares may be sold. Accordingly, if and when the Company is required to sell, the liquidity of those BAM Shares may be limited. This could affect the time it takes to sell the investments and the price obtained by the company for BAM Shares sold and in turn the retraction price of the Preferred Shares.

Use of Call Options

The Company may write covered call options on its BAM Shares to the extent necessary to fund any shortfall in Preferred Share dividends (see “Dividend Policy”). The Company is subject to the full risk of its investment position in the BAM Shares, including those securities that are subject to outstanding call options. In addition, the Company will not participate in any gain on the securities that are subject to outstanding call options above the strike price of the options. There is no assurance that a liquid exchange market will exist to permit the Company to write options on desired terms or to close out option positions should the Company desire to do so. The ability of the Company to close out its positions may also be affected by exchange imposed daily trading limits on options. In purchasing options, the Company would be subject to the credit risk that its counterparty may be unable to meet its obligations.

Cashless Retraction

Holders of Series 3 Preferred Shares will not receive cash as payment of the Preferred Share Retraction Price, but instead will receive Series 1 Debentures. There is a risk that the Company, or BAM Investments, as the case may be, will default in its obligation to pay principal and interest on the Series 1 Debentures as and when due. Because the Series 1 Debentures are not retractable the holder may be subject to this risk until the Series 3 Redemption Date.

Lack of Liquidity of Series 1 Debentures

Upon retraction of Series 3 Preferred Shares, a holder will be issued Series 1 Debentures. Series 1 Debentures, if and when issued, will be illiquid investments. There is currently no market through which the Series 1 Debentures may be sold and holders of Series 1 Debentures may not be able to resell the Series 1 Debentures acquired upon retraction of Series 3 Preferred Shares. The Company has no intention to create an active trading market for the Series 1 Debentures nor to list the Series 1 Debentures on any stock exchange.

Issuance of Debentures/Insolvency

The Company may risk insolvency if it cannot meet its obligations to pay the principal and interest on the Series 1 Debentures as and when due.

No Existing Trading Market

There is no market through which these securities may be sold and purchasers may not be able to resell securities purchased under the short form prospectus. This may affect the pricing of the securities in the secondary market, the transparency and availability of trading prices, the liquidity of the securities, and the extent of issuer regulation.

Prospective purchasers may wish to consult their own investment advisors for advice with respect to the merits of an investment in the Series 3 Preferred Shares.

ELIGIBILITY FOR INVESTMENT

In the opinion of Torys LLP and Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP, the Series 3 Preferred Shares will be qualified investments under the Tax Act for trusts governed by registered retirement saving plans, registered retirement income funds, deferred profit sharing plans and registered education savings plans and the Series 1 Debentures, if issued on the date of this short form prospectus, will be qualified investments under the Tax Act for trusts governed by registered retirement savings plans, registered retirement income funds, registered education savings plans or deferred profit sharing plans, other than deferred profit sharing plans for which the Company, or a corporation with which the Company does not deal at arm's length, is the employer.

CANADIAN FEDERAL INCOME TAX CONSIDERATIONS

In the opinion of Torys LLP and Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP, the following is, as of the date hereof, a summary of the principal Canadian federal income tax considerations generally applicable to the Company and to a holder of Series 3 Preferred Shares who acquires such shares pursuant to this short form prospectus and a holder of Series 1 Debentures acquired as a result of a retraction of the Series 3 Preferred Shares and who, for the purposes of the Tax Act, is resident in Canada, deals at arm's length and is not affiliated with the Company, and holds Series 3 Preferred Shares and Series 1 Debentures as capital property. This summary is not applicable to holders an interest in which would be a tax shelter investment for the purposes of the Tax Act. Series 3 Preferred Shares and Series 1 Debentures held by certain financial institutions will generally not be held as capital property and will be subject to special "mark-to-market" rules which are not discussed herein.

This summary is based upon the facts as set out in this short form prospectus, the provisions of the Tax Act and the regulations thereunder (the "Regulations") in force on the date hereof, all proposed amendments to the Tax Act and Regulations publicly announced by or on behalf of the Minister of Finance (Canada) prior to the date hereof and counsels' understanding of the current published administrative and assessing practices of the Canada Revenue Agency, or CRA. This summary also relies on certain advice received from Scotia Capital relative to the terms and conditions of the Preferred Shares and Capital Shares, and from the Company relative to the ownership of the Voting Shares of the Company, the terms of the BAM Shares and any agreements relating thereto. Except for the proposed amendments referred to above, this summary does not take into account or anticipate any change in law or administrative or assessing practices whether by legislation, governmental or judicial action.

The Company has elected, pursuant to subsection 39(4) of the Tax Act, to have all Canadian securities owned by it deemed to be capital properties.

This summary is of a general nature and does not take into account the tax laws of any province or territory or of any jurisdiction outside Canada. It is not intended to be, nor should it be construed to be, legal or tax advice to any particular purchaser. Prospective purchasers should consult their own tax advisers regarding the income tax considerations applicable to them.

Tax Treatment of the Company

Status

The Company is a "mutual fund corporation" as defined in the Tax Act. The Company intends to continue so to qualify throughout each subsequent taxation year in which any Series 3 Preferred Shares remain outstanding and this summary assumes that this will be the case.

Dividends

Dividends received by the Company on the BAM Shares held by it will be included in its income but will be deductible in computing its taxable income. The Company will generally be liable to pay a 33⅓% refundable tax under Part IV of the Tax Act on all such dividends received by it on the BAM Shares. In accordance with the Tax Act, any Part IV tax that is paid will be fully refunded to the Company on the payment by the Company of sufficient taxable ordinary dividends in the year or in subsequent taxation years.

The Company will not be subject to tax under Part VI.1 of the Tax Act on dividends that it pays on the Preferred Shares or Capital Shares.

Capital Gains

The Company may realize a capital gain (or sustain a capital loss) upon the disposition of BAM Shares to the extent that the proceeds of disposition thereof exceed (or are less than) the aggregate of the Company's adjusted cost base of such shares and any costs of disposition. In determining the income of the Company, premiums received by the Company on covered call options written by the Company (and which are not exercised prior to the end of the year) will constitute capital gains of the Company in the year received, and premiums received by the Company on covered call options which are exercised in the taxation year in which the option is written by the Company or a subsequent taxation year will be added in computing the proceeds of disposition to the Company of the BAM Shares disposed of by the Company on exercise of such call options, unless the Company is considered to be trading or dealing in securities or otherwise carrying on a business of buying and selling securities or the Company has acquired the securities in a transaction or transactions considered to be an adventure in the nature of trade. The Company holds and will purchase the BAM Shares with the objective of earning dividends thereon and the Company will write covered call options if necessary to support the distributions on the Preferred Shares. Pursuant to the election under subsection 39(4) of the Tax Act, transactions in Canadian securities (including the BAM Shares) will be treated on capital account. In accordance with CRA's published administrative practice, transactions undertaken by the Company in respect of options will be treated and reported for purposes of the Tax Act on capital account. As a mutual fund corporation, the Company maintains a capital gains dividend account in respect of capital gains realized by the Company and from which it may elect to pay dividends which are treated as capital gains in the hands of shareholders of the Company ("capital gains dividends"). See "Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations — Tax Treatment of Dividends on Series 3 Preferred Shares" below. The Company, being a mutual fund corporation, will be entitled to refunds in accordance with the provisions of the Tax Act of substantially all tax paid on net taxable capital gains on payment by the Company of sufficient capital gains dividends or redemptions.

Other Income

Interest income and securities lending fees earned by the Company will be included in computing its taxable income.

Issue Expenses

The Company will be entitled to deduct an amount equal to the reasonable expenses that it incurs in the course of issuing Series 3 Preferred Shares. Such issue expenses, including Underwriters' fees, will be deductible by the Company rateably over a five-year period. Generally, the Company will also be entitled to deduct administrative expenses. Any non-capital losses incurred by the Company may generally be carried forward or back in accordance with the rules and limitations contained in the Tax Act and deducted in computing the taxable income of the Company.

Net Tax Liability

As a result of the deductions and refunds of tax described above, it is not anticipated that the Company will be subject to any material net tax liability.

Tax Treatment of Dividends on Series 3 Preferred Shares

Ordinary dividends received on Series 3 Preferred Shares by a holder will be included in computing the holder's income.

In the case of a holder that is an individual, ordinary dividends will be subject to the gross-up and dividend tax credit rules under the Tax Act normally applicable to taxable dividends received from a taxable Canadian corporation. Draft legislation released by the Minister of Finance (Canada) on June 29, 2006 proposes to enhance such gross-up and dividend tax credit for eligible dividends received after 2005 from taxable Canadian corporations. Eligible dividends will generally include dividends paid after 2005 by taxable Canadian corporations, which dividends have been designated as eligible dividends by the dividend-paying corporations.

Ordinary dividends on the Series 3 Preferred Shares received by a holder that is a corporation other than a “specified financial institution” (as defined in the Tax Act) will normally be deductible by the corporation in computing its taxable income.

In the case of a holder that is a specified financial institution, ordinary dividends received on Series 3 Preferred Shares will be deductible in computing its taxable income only if either:

- (a) the specified financial institution did not acquire the Series 3 Preferred Shares in the ordinary course of its business; or
- (b) at the time of receipt of the dividend by the specified financial institution,
 - (i) the Series 3 Preferred Shares are listed on a prescribed stock exchange; and
 - (ii) dividends are received in respect of not more than 10% of the issued and outstanding Series 3 Preferred Shares by
 - (A) the specified financial institution; or
 - (B) the specified financial institution and persons with whom it does not deal at arm’s length (within the meaning of the Tax Act).

For these purposes, a beneficiary of a trust will be deemed to receive the amount of any dividend received by the trust and designated to the beneficiary, effective at the time the dividend was received by the trust, and a member of a partnership will be considered to have received that partner’s share of a dividend received by the partnership, effective at the time the dividend was received by the partnership.

A holder of Series 3 Preferred Shares which is a corporation other than a private corporation or a financial intermediary corporation (as defined in the Tax Act) will generally be subject to a 10% tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act in respect of any dividends received by it on the Series 3 Preferred Shares, to the extent that such dividends are deductible in computing its taxable income.

A holder which is a “private corporation” (as defined in the Tax Act) or any other corporation controlled directly or indirectly by or for the benefit of an individual (other than a trust) or a related group of individuals (other than trusts) may be liable to pay a refundable tax under Part IV of the Tax Act, generally imposed at the rate of 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ %, on ordinary dividends received on the Series 3 Preferred Shares, to the extent that such dividends are deductible in computing its taxable income.

The amount of any capital gains dividend received by a holder of Series 3 Preferred Shares from the Company will be considered to be a capital gain of such holder from the disposition of capital property in the taxation year of the holder in which the capital gains dividend is received.

Redemptions, Retractions and Other Dispositions of Series 3 Preferred Shares

A holder who disposes of, or who is deemed to dispose of, a Series 3 Preferred Share, including a disposition to the Company (whether on a retraction, redemption or otherwise), will realize a capital gain (or sustain a capital loss) equal to the amount by which the proceeds of disposition exceed (or are less than) the aggregate of the holder’s adjusted cost base of such share and any reasonable costs of disposition. Where the holder of a Series 3 Preferred Share is a corporation, in certain circumstances the amount of any capital loss otherwise determined may be reduced by the amount of ordinary dividends previously received on the Series 3 Preferred Share. Similar rules may apply where a trust or partnership owns Series 3 Preferred Shares.

One-half of a capital gain must be included in income as a taxable capital gain. One-half of a capital loss is an “allowable capital loss”. An allowable capital loss may be deducted against taxable capital gains realized in the year, in any of the three preceding taxation years or in any subsequent taxation year in accordance with the provisions of the Tax Act. “Canadian-controlled private corporations” (as defined in the Tax Act) may be liable to pay an additional refundable tax of 6⅔% on taxable capital gains.

A taxable gain realized by an individual may give rise to a liability for alternative minimum tax.

Interest on Series 1 Debentures

A holder that is a corporation, partnership, unit trust or trust of which a corporation or partnership is a beneficiary will be required to include in computing its income for a taxation year any interest on a Series 1 Debenture that accrues or is deemed to accrue to the holder to the end of that taxation year or becomes receivable or is received by the holder before the end of that taxation year, except to the extent that such interest was otherwise included in the holder’s income for a preceding taxation year.

Any other holder, including an individual and trust of which neither a corporation or a partnership is a beneficiary, will be required to include in income for a taxation year any interest on a Series 1 Debenture received or receivable by such holder in that year (depending upon the method regularly followed by the holder in computing income), except to the extent that the interest was included in the holder’s income for a preceding taxation year.

Disposition of Series 1 Debentures

On a disposition or deemed disposition of a Series 1 Debenture, whether on redemption, purchase for cancellation or otherwise, a holder will generally be required to include in income the amount of interest accrued or deemed to accrue on the Series 1 Debenture from the date of the last interest payment to the date of disposition to the extent that such amount has not otherwise been included in the holder’s income for the taxation year or a previous taxation year. In general, a disposition or deemed disposition of a Series 1 Debenture will give rise to a capital gain (or capital loss) to the extent that the proceeds of disposition, net of any accrued interest and any other amount included in computing income and any reasonable costs of disposition, exceed (or are less than) the adjusted cost base of the Series 1 Debenture to the holder immediately before the disposition. Series 1 Debentures acquired on the retraction of Series 3 Preferred Shares will have a cost to the holder equal to the fair market value thereof at the time of retraction.

One-half of the amount of any capital gain (as a taxable capital gain) realized by a holder in a taxation year generally must be included in the holder’s income for that year, and one-half of the amount of any capital loss realized by a holder in a taxation year may generally be deducted as an allowable capital loss from taxable capital gains realized by the holder in that year. Allowable capital losses in excess of taxable capital gains may be carried back and deducted in any of the three preceding taxation years or carried forward and deducted in any subsequent taxation year against net taxable capital gains realized in such years to the extent and under the circumstances described in the Tax Act.

A holder that is a Canadian-controlled private corporation (as defined in the Tax Act) may be liable to pay an additional refundable tax of 6⅔% on certain investment income, including amounts of interest and taxable capital gains.

USE OF PROCEEDS

The net proceeds from the Offering of the Series 3 Preferred Shares (after deducting the Underwriters’ fees and expenses of the issue) are estimated to be \$193,250,000 and will be used by the Company to fund the purchase of 3,534,000 BAM Shares. See “Purchase of BAM Shares”. The Offering price and terms of the Series 3 Preferred Shares were established through negotiation between the Company and the Underwriters. Except as noted herein under “Plan of Distribution” and “Interest of Management and Others in Material Transactions”, the net proceeds of this Offering will not be applied for the benefit of the Underwriters.

PLAN OF DISTRIBUTION

Under an agreement dated as of December 20, 2006 (“Underwriting Agreement”) between the Company and Underwriters, the Company has agreed to issue and sell, and the Underwriters have agreed to purchase, on January 10, 2007 or on such other date as may be agreed, but in any event not later than January 31, 2007 subject to compliance with all necessary legal requirements and to terms and conditions contained in the Underwriting Agreement, 8,000,000 Series 3 Preferred Shares at a price of \$25.00 per share, payable in cash to the Company against delivery of a certificate or certificates representing such Series 3 Preferred Shares. In consideration for their services in connection with the Offering, the Company has agreed to pay the Underwriters a fee equal to \$0.25 per Series 3 Preferred Shares sold to institutions and \$0.75 per share with respect to all other Series 3 Preferred Shares. Assuming that no Series 3 Preferred Shares are sold to such institutions, the Underwriters’ fee will be \$6,000,000. The obligations of the Underwriters under the Underwriting Agreement are several and may be terminated at their discretion upon the occurrence of certain stated events. The Underwriters are, however, obligated to take up and pay for all of the securities if any of the securities are purchased under the Underwriting Agreement.

Subscriptions for the securities to be offered hereby will be accepted by the Closing Date. The Series 3 Preferred Shares are being offered only on the basis that each outstanding Capital Share will be subdivided so that an equal number of Capital Shares and Preferred Shares are issued and outstanding upon completion of the Offering. The right is reserved to close the subscription books at any time without notice and to accept or reject, in whole or in part, any subscriptions received.

Pursuant to policy statements of the Ontario Securities Commission and the Autorité des marchés financiers, the Underwriters may not, throughout the period of distribution under this short form prospectus, bid for or purchase Series 3 Preferred Shares. The foregoing restriction is subject to certain exceptions, as long as the bid or purchase is not engaged in for the purpose of creating actual or apparent active trading in or raising the price of such securities. These exceptions include a bid or purchase permitted under the Universal Market Integrity Rules administered by Market Regulation Services Inc. relating to market stabilization and passive market making activities and a bid or purchase made for and on behalf of a customer where the order was not solicited during the period of distribution. Pursuant to the first mentioned exception, in connection with this Offering the Underwriters may over allot or effect transactions which stabilize or maintain the market price of the Series 3 Preferred Shares at levels other than those which might otherwise prevail in the open market. Such transactions, if commenced, may be discontinued at any time.

The Company has received conditional approval to list the securities distributed under this short form prospectus on the TSX. Listing will be subject to the issuer fulfilling all of the listing requirements of the TSX.

RATINGS

The Series 3 Preferred Shares are rated Pfd-2 by DBRS. The DBRS rating of Pfd-2 is the second of three sub-categories within the second highest rating of the five standard categories of ratings utilized by DBRS for preferred shares.

Credit ratings are intended to provide investors with an independent measure of the credit quality of an issue of securities. The credit ratings accorded to the Series 3 Preferred Shares by these rating agencies are not recommendations to purchase, hold or sell the Series 3 Preferred Shares inasmuch as such ratings do not comment as to market price or suitability for a particular investor. There is no assurance that any rating will remain in effect for any given period of time or that any rating will not be revised or withdrawn entirely by a rating agency in the future if, in its judgment, circumstances so warrant.

CAPITALIZATION

The capitalization of the Company at September 30, 2006, and at such date as adjusted to give effect to the issue and sale of the Series 3 Preferred Shares offered hereby and the stock split of the Capital Shares is set forth in the table below.

EARNINGS COVERAGE RATIO

The Company's annual dividend requirements on all its Preferred Shares, after giving effect to the issue of the Series 3 Preferred Shares, amounted to \$20,472,500. The Company's pro forma annual dividend income on the BAM Shares, after giving effect to the acquisition of an additional 3,534,000 BAM Shares, is \$22,091,000. The Company's earnings before interest and income tax for the 12 months ended September 30, 2006 was \$14,729,000, which was 1.25 times the Company's aggregate dividend and interest requirements for such period.

INTEREST OF MANAGEMENT AND OTHERS IN MATERIAL TRANSACTIONS

The Company and its senior officers and directors file insider trading reports using the System for Electronic Data on Insiders (SEDI), as if the Company was not a mutual fund, in accordance with applicable provincial securities legislation. The Company has agreed to use its best efforts to cause all future senior officers and directors to file insider trading reports as if the Company was not a mutual fund, in accordance with applicable provincial securities legislation and to deliver to each applicable provincial securities regulatory authority an undertaking to file insider trading reports in accordance with applicable provincial legislation. Each of Trilon Securities and the Company has agreed to advise promptly each of the provincial securities regulatory authorities in the event that it is unsuccessful in causing any of its applicable officers or directors to comply with the foregoing reporting requirements. The foregoing undertakings shall remain in full force until such time as all of the Preferred Shares have been redeemed, retracted or purchased for cancellation.

Pursuant to the Securities Purchase Agreement with an affiliate of Scotia Capital, 3,534,000 BAM Shares will be acquired by the Company for cash consideration to be funded by the proceeds of the Offering. No fees will be payable by the Company to Scotia Capital or such affiliate in respect of the purchase of BAM Shares.

The matters referred to under “Eligibility for Investment”, “Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations” and certain other legal matters relating to the securities described in this short form prospectus will be passed upon by Torys LLP, on behalf of the Company, and by Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP, on behalf of the Underwriters.

As of the date hereof (a) the partners and associates of Torys LLP beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, less than 1% of the outstanding securities of the Company or any of its associates or affiliates; and (b) the partners and associates of Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP beneficially owned, directly or indirectly, less than 1% of the outstanding securities of the Company or any of its associates or affiliates.

AUDITORS, TRANSFER AGENT, REGISTRAR AND CUSTODIAN
